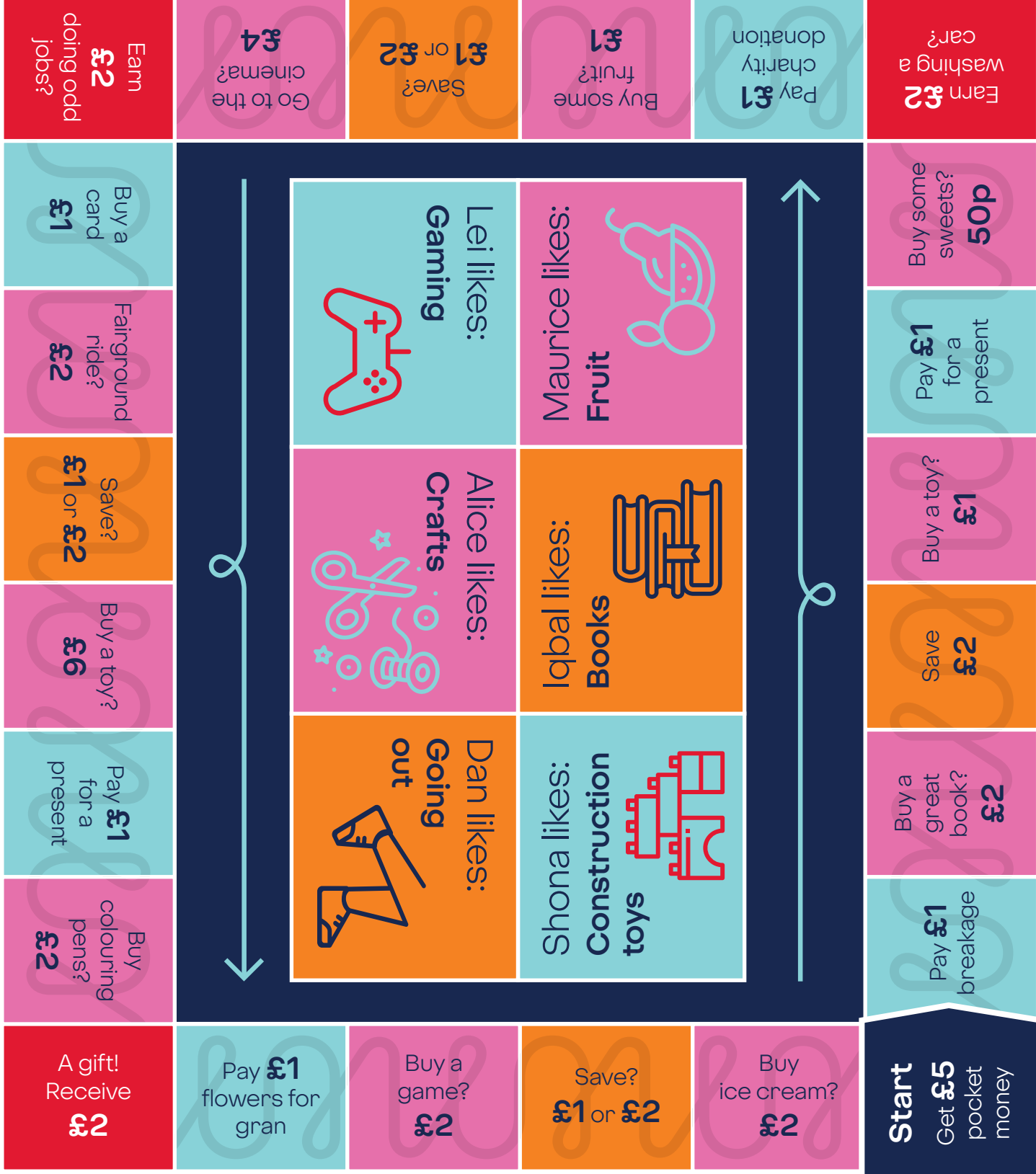

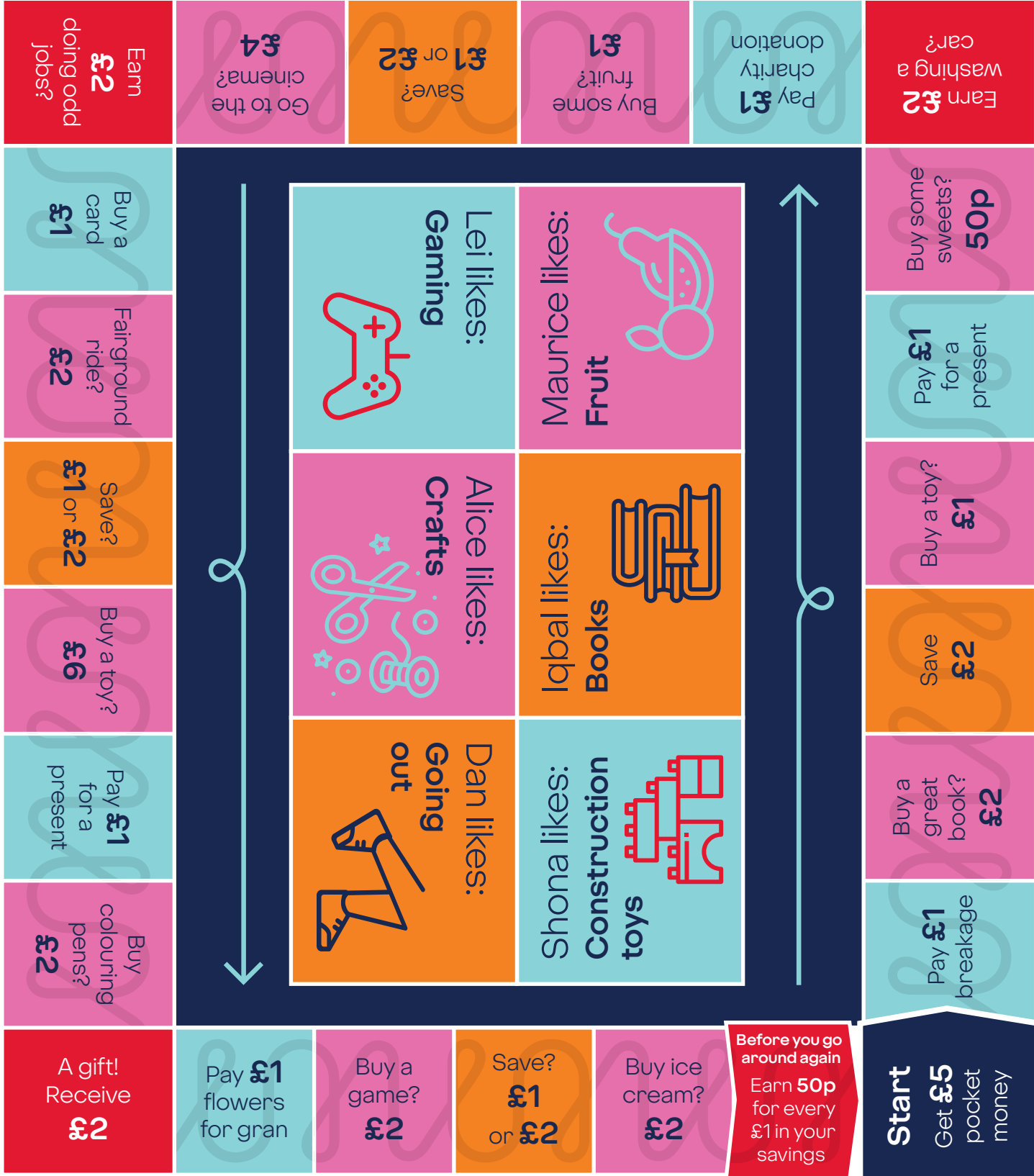

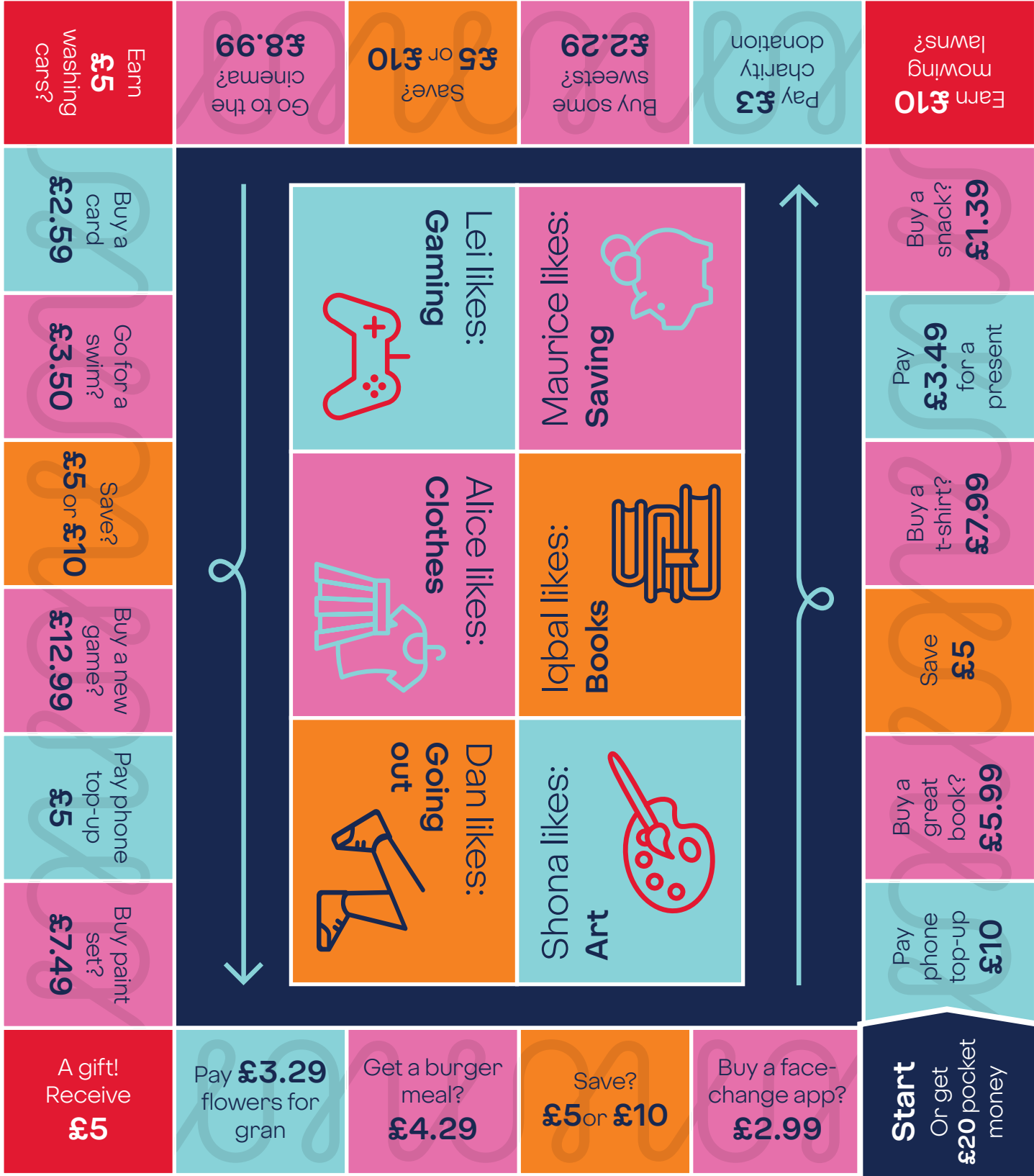

- When you land on **START** again, you get £20 pocket money
- If you run out of money, transfer money back out of your savings or keep rolling until you get back to **START** (but you can't buy or save until then)

Money tracker

Start with your first **£5 pocket money**. As you land on each square, add or subtract your spending, saving or earning and write what it was for.

When you save, add that money into your savings column. If you run out of money you can choose to transfer money out of your savings into your pocket money, or keep rolling until you get back to START (but you can't buy or save until then). Play for a minimum of 2 rounds.
